tors regularly to ensure they are in working condition in case of an emergency.

- » <u>Sump Pumps</u> Sump pumps are important if you wish to keep your basement free of water. Sump pumps are made to pump water underground near your foundation back outside, but if your sump pump is not working, that water will eventually make its way into your basement, resulting in costly repairs.
- » <u>Walkway / Stair Repair</u> After a long winter of freezing weather, the water able to get under your sidewalk or driveway can wreak havoc on your concrete. When the water freezes and thaws, it can cause the concrete to heave or sink, making the area unsafe if this happens, it is best to get the concrete repaired.

- YELLOWJACKETS / BALDFACE HORNETS
  - <u>Why Treat?</u> While having stinging insects around your home during the summer months causes enough problems, baldface hornets also bring an element of pain to the situation. Bald face hornets are the most painful stinging insect in the United States, as well as the most aggressive. If yellow jackets find an opening on your home, they will proceed to nest in your wall voids and can even eat through drywall to get inside your home.
- MOUSE PREVENTATIVE Important for Summer, Fall & Winter
  - Why Treat? Although mice appear to be harmless, they can easily cost you thousands of dollars repairing the damage. Mice are known to chew through electrical wires and anything else that they are confronted with. Like bats, mice can also ruin insulation in your attic and fit through the smallest of holes. Mice also carry many diseases that are dangerous to you and your family.

#### **ADDITIONAL SUMMER SUGGESTIONS**

- » <u>Prune Shrubs / Trees</u> If you have trees and shrubs planted around your home, it is important to stay on top of trimming them if you desire a particular shape. If shrubs go untrimmed, they will often grow tall and scraggly, instead of full and beautiful.
- » <u>Water Heater</u> Various sediments, such as dirt and other minerals, make their way into your hot water tank when water is pumped into it. This can greatly decrease the efficiency of the unit, which will cost you more money. Flushing your hot water tank is a great way to remove the dirt and debris and make sure your hot water tank is running smoothly.
  - 1. Turn off the electrical or gas on the water heater.
  - 2. Turn off water from the inlet valve, which supplies water to the tank.
  - 3. Attach a hose to the valve on the bottom of the tank, which will be the drain valve. Run the hose outside or into a bucket. (Be aware the water coming out will be VERY HOT!)
  - 4. Turn on the tank's pressure-release valve or turn on a warm water faucet inside the house.
  - 5. If flushing sediment, open the water heater's drain valve and let about 4 gallons drain.
  - 6. Close the drain valve, turn the water back on to supply the tank and allow the tank to fill back up with water, then turn the electrical / gas supply back on.
- » <u>Tree Removal</u> Unfortunately, sometimes trees in your yard die or grow into structures and cause damage to foundations or power lines. When this happens, you could trim it if the situation isn't too severe, but other times the tree has to be completely removed to make sure the damage to your home or property isn't continued.
- » <u>Pool Opening / Chemicals</u> In order to get your pool ready for summer, you must first clean all the debris that has fallen into the water throughout the fall and winter. You must ensure your system is





working correctly and the water's PH level is between 7.4 and 7.6.

- » <u>Stain Decks / Wooden Structures</u> Your wooden deck takes an immense beating between the hot sun during the summer and the snow during the winter. This can often cause the paint or stain to crack and peel, which means it is time to repaint or re-stain it. Staying on top of deck maintenance will greatly extend the life of your deck.
- » Sprinkler System Leaks



#### CHIMNEY SWEEPING

- Why Clean? A fireplace that burns wood is a great way to warm your house during the cold winter months. Unfortunately, it can also be a dangerous addition to your home if it is not properly maintained. Creosote builds up in chimneys and if it isn't cleaned regularly, it can close the opening of your chimney and cause a fire in your home. #### BOX ELDER BUGS / ASIAN LADY BEETLES

- Why Treat? Asian lady beetles are known to overwinter in your home, which can cause issues with allergies and make a mess. They also emit a terrible odor and can stain items in your home with a yellowish tint. Box elder bugs are a nuisance, but they are not known to cause any damage to your home; however, they have the ability to deform trees and shrubs.

#### CARPET CLEANING

- Why Treat? After a year of mud and dirt being tracked through your house, cleaning your carpet is a great way to revitalize the beauty inside your home.

#### FIREWOOD

- Quality: Fireplace and stove wood shall be advertised, offered for sale, and sold only by measure, using the term "cord" and fractional parts of a cord or the cubic meter.
- <u>Prohibited Term</u>: The terms "face cord," "pile" "truckload" or terms of similar import shall not be used when advertising, offering for sale, or selling wood for use as fuel.

#### GRUB CONTROL

- Why Treat? If you strive for a beautiful, lush lawn, grubs can undo all your hard work. Grubs feed on roots, which often tend to be the roots of your turf. One way to tell if you have an infestation is if your lawn or garden turns purple near the bottom of the stalk and begin to die off.

#### DRYER CLEANING

- Why? Dry lint can quickly build up, which poses a serious risk to your home. While most of the lint is collected in the lint trap on your dryer, some makes its way into the exhaust pipe and begins to build up. This lint is extremely flammable and should be cleaned yearly to ensure your family's safety.



#### ADDITIONAL FALL SUGGESTIONS

- » Snow Blower / Tractor Maintenance Fall is a good time to make sure your snow blower is ready to use before winter is here. It is a good time to take your machine in for a tune up to ensure it runs all winter long. #### CARPENTER ANTS

#### • BED BUGS

- Why Treat? Despite what many people think, bed bugs have nothing to do with cleanliness because of the fact that they are hitchhikers. It only takes one bedbug to infest a house and they multiply constantly; once they are in the home, it is a long slow process to rid the residence of the pests. Bed bugs could be around for a while before they are noticed because they are so small. It is best to start treatment as soon as they are discovered because the problem will only worsen. Although their name suggests otherwise, bed bugs are found all over the house, including electrical outlets, books and furniture, not just beds. Bed bugs need blood to survive and typically find this in humans, although many don't realize they are even being bit until the areas begin to itch.

#### SKUNKS

- Why Treat? Skunks around your house, especially if you have outdoor pets, can turn your life upside down if they cross paths. Most people know someone whose pet was sprayed by a skunk and the smell is unbearable and nearly impossible to remove. When faced with this situation, it is best to have a professional company trap and relocate the animal.

#### SEPTIC

- Salt Keep on hand.
- Snow Removal Keep a company name and number on hand.
- Christmas Lights Installation / Removal
- Plumbers and Water Removal Keep a company name and number on hand.

#### **AUTOMOTIVE MAINTENANCE TIPS**

#### TIRES

- -Rotate tires every 5,000 miles to ensure equal wear on all your tires. (Recommended twice a year)
- It is a good idea to check the pressure in your tires at least once a week. Low tire pressure will make them wear down faster, as well as affect your fuel economy.
- Be sure to periodically check the tread on your tires to ensure the wear is even and there is enough tread left to make them safe to drive on. Most tires have wear bars in them to remind you it is time for new tires.

#### UNDER THE HOOD

BELTS: The belts under your hood are mostly made of rubber, which break down faster under the hot conditions near the engine. It is a good idea to check all your belts every 25,000 miles to make sure they are not frayed or cracked.

CHECK OIL: Park on level ground and let engine cool. Pull out dipstick and wipe clean; put dipstick back in and wait a minute. Pull back out and read oil level. If too low, add some oil. (Be sure not to overfill oil; it can damage the engine.)

COOLANT LEVEL: Make sure the engine is cool before checking; coolants are under a lot of pressure when hot and can burn you. Located in a semi-clear white bottle (see owner's manual), check to see if the fluid is between the high and low marks.

AIR FILTER: Air filters should be changed once a year or every 12,000 miles.

#### ELECTRICAL

- Disconnecting the Battery: Whenever you disconnect the battery, be sure to disconnect the negative first to make sure an electrical short doesn't occur. When reconnecting, connect the positive first.
- Battery Terminals: Check battery terminals periodically to make sure they are clean.
- Blinkers and Headlights: When replacing a blinker or headlight, be sure not to touch the bulb with your bare hands because the oils will cause the area to heat up faster and eventually crack.

#### GET YOUR CAR READY FOR WINTER

When winter starts approaching, it is a good idea to start putting some equipment in your car to ready yourself in case of an emergency:

- Jumper Cables
- Blanket
- Hats
- Gloves
- Small Snow Shovel
- Kitty Litter (for traction)
- Emergency Triangle (or a rag to hang on antenna or mirror)
- Window Scraper
- Non-Perishable Foods


